

Bluegrass7 Shot Locator Tool

This is a simple look-up table that converts Red CL ball locations **beyond the 430-yd mark on Bluegrass hole #7** to Black CL locations. This table is meant to make it easier to place your ball marker on the carry of your (2nd) shot **when playing the Red CL on this hole**.

There are two options, depending on whether you are: (1) **left of the Red CL** or (2) **on the Red CL or right of it**. Just enter the distance and L/R coordinates of your (2nd) shot from the Red CL (i.e., where the ball is supposed to land), and the tool will tell you where that is in terms of the Black CL. (How you apply the roll is up to you. Assuming there is unimpeded FW roll and the tee is due south, I would be inclined to move the ball one diagonal north for 5- and 10-yard rolls and 2 diagonals north for a 15-yard roll. Your mileage may vary.)

The tool will tell you the terrain on the Bluegrass APBA course board where your ball landed. That way you can quickly figure out how much roll you have, if any. Note that because of a dogleg left at the 470-yard mark, **there are two possible places you could put your ball marker on the APBA course board for some shots** that land right of the Red CL. The table assumes you will place your ball on the APBA course board **AFTER the dogleg at the 470-yard mark**, except for shots that don't carry that far. (Shots that carry short of the dogleg are shaded green in the table.) The terrain at these locations has been assigned accordingly.

The terrain abbreviations are self-explanatory, except that RRT means that the shot has landed within a tree square and does not roll (but the lie is in the RR, not under a tree).
